TERMINAL ONE REDEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

SPEAKER:

Wally Caban, PE, CCM, Chief of Construction, Engineering, The Port Authority of New York & New Jersey

The "Terminal One Redevelopment Program" presentation will include constructing a new terminal with enhanced world class amenities designed to provide improved customer experiences and services. Included will be some history of the current airport with its current terminals to highlight the growth of the industry and how the PANYNJ managed it thus far. The presentation will touch upon design-build concepts and will include current construction progress photos along with their scheduled target dates. The PANYNJ will also include some information on contracting opportunities.

Wallace Caban oversees the Construction Management Division for the Port Authority of NY & NJ Engineering Department. Port Authority staff members are located at facilities including: six airports (John F. Kennedy, LaGuardia, Newark, Teterboro, Stewart and Atlantic City International airports); four bridges (George Washington, Goethals, Bayonne and Outerbridge Crossing); two tunnels (Lincoln and Holland); three bus and transportation terminals; a PATH Railway System, multiple cargo terminals and ports in both New York and in New Jersey. The Port Authority is also rebuilding the World Trade Center. During his 32-plus year Port Authority career, Mr. Caban has held increasingly responsible positions within the engineering department—construction management division at both JFK and LaGuardia. He was previously Engineer of Construction- LaGuardia/Stewart International Airports before being selected for his new position as Chief of Construction for the Construction Management Division. His most recent accomplishment was the on-site coordination of activities required for the successful completion of the Bayonne Bridge Raise the Roadway Project which opened the New York Kill Van Kull navigational channel to Port Newark and Port Elizabeth for the larger shipping freighters on June 8, 2017.
